Port Denarau Marina Launches Major Infrastructure Projects to Boost Superyacht Capacity

Denarau Island, Fiji – Port Denarau Marina, Fiji's leading yachting gateway, has officially commenced two major capital projects aimed at expanding its superyacht infrastructure in response to increasing demand from the global yachting community. The FJ\$6 million investment includes a 203-metre extension of the superyacht jetty and comprehensive dredging works to improve navigational access.

These projects form a key part of the Marina's long-term strategic vision to reinforce its position as the premier superyacht destination in the South Pacific.

The jetty extension will introduce seven new superyacht berths, accommodating up to four vessels of 75 metres and three vessels of 40 metres. Designed with enhanced utilities and support services, the extension will improve berth availability and vessel turnover, particularly during peak cruising periods. This will increase private berthing capacity to 62 berths: 27 superyacht berths for vessels over 24 m and 35 yacht berths for vessels from 16 m, with the largest berth accommodating up to 115 meters.

Simultaneously, dredging operations are underway to deepen approach channels and turning basins, ensuring safe and efficient access for superyachts, commercial vessels, and other marine traffic. These works are essential to maintaining operational resilience and safety during Fiji's high-traffic yachting season.

The development is guided by findings from the 2019 Fiji Yachting Survey, conducted in collaboration with industry stakeholders and the Market Development Facility, which highlighted the growing appeal of Fiji as a superyacht hub:

- · 83% of visiting superyachts identified Port Denarau Marina as their preferred port of entry, citing access to services and provisioning.
- Over 70% of captains and crew expressed a need for more dedicated berthing and improved seasonal access.
- The average length of stay for superyachts in Fiji has risen to over 60 days, with many vessels using Port Denarau as a strategic base for regional cruising.

"We're excited to begin work on this significant upgrade. The data affirms what we've consistently observed—Fiji is rapidly emerging as a key hub for superyachts in the South Pacific," said Cynthia Rasch, Chief Executive Officer of Port Denarau Marina. "This FJ\$6 million investment delivers the critical infrastructure needed to support that growth and future-proof our operations. Our customers deserve the very best, and this development underscores our ongoing commitment to enhancing their experience. These capital works not only respond to market demand but also reinforce our vision to position Fiji as a premier yachting destination on the global stage."

Malakai Naiyaga, Chairman of the Board, added: "The extension of our superyacht berths and the launch of dredging works represent a major milestone—not just for Port Denarau Marina, but for Fiji's marine tourism sector as a whole. This is the beginning of a broader investment program to elevate our facilities to world-class standards and cement Fiji's status as the superyacht capital of the South Pacific."

The projects are scheduled for completion just in time for the start of the 2025 cruising season and align with Port Denarau Marina's strategic priorities of sustainability, innovation, and service excellence.
